# **STEP 1: Assessment**

# **STEP 2: Theory**

FORM: Conjugate the verb "work" in the future tense with "will" and "be going to" in the chart below.

Affirmative	I will work You will work He will work	I am going to work You are going to work He is going to work	
Negative	You won't work He won't work	You aren't going to work  He isn't going to work	
Yes/No Question and Short Answer	Will you work ? Yes, I will Will he work ? No, he won't	Are you going to work ? Yes, I am  Is he going to work ? No, he isn't

# **STEP 4: Production task**

Example: I won't have children. Will you have children?


- After, the second player marks an "O" and follows the same instructions.
