Simple past	He made a mistake.		(by someone).
Future/modals	He will make a mistake.		(by someone).
Present perfect	He has made a mistake.		(by someone).

- a. The focus is on the result rather than the doer of the action, like in scientific, business or technical writing.
- **b.** The doer of the action is unknown, unimportant or obvious.
